Before you choose a lawn, look at the board inside the equipment shed window to see which lawns have standard hoops and which have tournament hoops.

Our lawns are our most precious asset. They have a world class reputation, being generally true and flat, and with hoops that are firm and can be a real challenge, event to elite players.

Divots have been appearing regularly, sometimes in significant numbers and size. It is easy to make a divot, but please take some time to repair them. Replace any turf and, using a point such as a car key, lift the compressed dirt and tamp down. If the damage is too extensive to easily repair, please let Chris Clarke know so he can make more extensive repairs.

Club days are Wed and Sat from 10 am and 1 pm so try to get there with at least ten minutes to spare so we can fit you into practice and/or games as you

Clubrooms

Please keep the clubrooms clean, dishes washed and the place tidy.

Now we have a Rheem boiler there is no need to boil the kettle. With people at the club most days, the Rheem can be left on during summer. During winter, please turn it off as you lock up.

Business House functions

Trolleys

Put away bisques, pegs etc. and check that there is a complete set of 8 balls, 8 clips, 6 hoops, 4 corner flags and a centre peg on the trolleys before putting the trolley back in the equipment shed in order. Please keep the shed tidy.
