Volunteer hours

Security

Recently, while members were playing croquet, a set of keys and a jacket were stolen. Entry was gained through the unlocked kitchen door.

The kitchen door is not visible from the lawns so it is a security risk to leave it unlocked when there is no one in the club house.

So please do not leave valuables in the clubhouse and keep the kitchen door locked whilst playing when there is no one in the club house. The ranch slider can be left unlocked for easy access.

If you are playing on lawn 7 and there is no one playing on the other lawns, all doors to the club house and shed should be kept locked.

A notice will be fastened to the kitchen door to remind you.

A lock will soon be put on one of the window boxes so members can securely keep their belongings. But please don't overuse this as there is limited space.

Lawns

In mid-March lawns 3, 4 and 7 will be grooved, top-dressed and resown. They will then be closed for the rest of the season.

Fence

You will have noticed that the fence is looking rather tired with several posted rusted off at ground level. Canterbury Community Trust has given us \$5000 towards replacing the fence. This is not sufficient to replace all of the fence so we are trying to raise further funds and will be replacing at least some of the fence this year.

Improvements

A number of improvements have been made around the club.

- 1. Mallet storage has been improved and increased. We now have space to hold all our mallets. There is also a separate area for members to store their own mallets, separate to the club mallets.
- 2. Irrigation has been installed in the gardens by the club house and along lawns 5 and 6. The irrigation for the triangular garden by the club house needs to be fed by connecting a hose.

BBO

We now have a new bigger and better BBQ. It has been fastened to the outside of the equipment shed for storage. The key is on the same ring as the ranch slider. Please look after the BBQ and always clean it after use and turn off the tap at the gas bottle and store the gas bottle in the equipment shed when not in use. The cooking plates and grills should be scrubbed in the kitchen sink with plenty of hot water and dishwasher detergent and a stiff brush.

Last time it was used it was filthy and the gas bottle tap was left on. This can result in the gas bottle emptying prematurely.

Corporate events

We have had 22 corporate events this season. This has earned us over \$8000 which is more than we received in subscriptions. Running a top-quality club is not cheap. We typically spend \$10,000 per year on maintaining the lawns and there is over \$2000 of equipment on each trolley.

A big thank you to everyone who helped. It has been a big effort.

New member promotion

We have introduced a promotion for new members. If an existing member introduces a new member to the club, when the new member pays their subscription for their second season, the introducing member will receive a \$50 credit towards their sub.

The AC weekend tournament was held 26 and 27 September. There were a few showers of rain and the temperature dropped at times but the weather was often pleasant. There were seven entries in the open which was played as a Swiss. Michael Wright (Wellington) successfully defended his title winning all his five games. Jenny Clarke was runner-up.

There were eight entries in the handicap. It was played as a Swiss with three games on Saturday and two on Sunday. Both Kent Caddick and Ken Kinzett (both St James Park) won four out of five games. Their opponents were rated identically, but Kent was the winner as he won his game against Ken.

Parking at United

Parking can be at a premium, especially for some weekday interclub events.

As the public car park has a 3-hour time limit, players from other clubs risk getting a ticket if they park there. The Christchurch City Council used to supply temporary car passes for our visitors, but stopped doing that some years ago.

United club members who have a car pass can assist by parking their car in the public car park and allowing visitors to park in the parks by the club house.

Remember that the car parks are shared with High School Old Boys, so please cooperate with them.
