Boiling water heater

You may have noticed steam and water coming out of the overflow pipe next to the outside toilet at times. This is from the boiling water heater in the kitchen.

The boiling point has recently been recalibrated so hopefully it will stop boiling over.

It has also been adjusted to switch to standby outside the hours of 8am to 5:30pm. It will also switch to standby after two hours without use.

In standby, the temperature is dropped to 80°C. If this happens, and you want boiling water, press any of the buttons to get it to activate again.

Don't switch the heater off, or it will lose its settings. If it continues to boil over, please let me know.

New club day hours

Changes to the GC handicapping

The current range of Golf Croquet handicaps is 0 to 12. Starting 1 September 2016 the handicap system will be changing and the range extended to -6 to 16.

You must have your handicap transferred to the new system before you play any competitive games. Please bring your existing handicap card to the club so we can issue you with a new card. New cards should be available this week. Mary Morrison is organising this change.

Generally, if your handicap is between 3 and 12 it will remain the same, but your index points will change. If your handicap is 12, and you are struggling getting your handicap above 0, talk to Mary.

For players with handicap between 0 and 2, the new handicap will be based on your world ranking.

Kitchen

We now have a dishwasher. When the "Dirty" sign is on the door, put your dirty cups and glasses in the machine. Please ensure that any crockery is well rinsed, so a short wash can be used. If the machine is full, follow the instructions on the sign to start the machine and turn the sign over to show "Clean". If the "Clean" sign is showing and the machine is finished, please empty it.

We hope to have the hot water unit back in service soon.

Answerphone

The phone on the table has been replaced with a cordless phone with an answering system. This will allow us to include the club number on any publicity and we will be able to receive messages even if there is no one at the club. Messages can be retrieved remotely.

You may take the cordless phone out on the lawns if there is no one else around – but not if it is raining.

If someone calls the club and you don't manage to get to the phone before the call is answered the welcome message and the caller leaving a message can be heard on the loudspeaker. You can answer the call by removing the cordless phone from its cradle.

If you listen to a message and delete it, you are responsible for dealing with the caller. If you know there are messages, please let a committee member know. The number of messages is shown on the display of the base unit.

Setting out hoops

When setting out hoops some players enthusiastically use the mallet to drive the hoops in.

Hoops do not have to be hammered in until the carrots are below ground level. There is a one inch (25mm) tolerance on the height of hoops, and the carrots will not interfere with the ball if they protrude.

Hammer hoops only until they are just firm. This allows them to be driven in further as the holes wear with use and delays the time when new hoop holes need to be made. The team that resets hoops will thank you for not creating unnecessary y work for them.

CCA Open

The CCA Open and Grades Association Croquet Championships were scheduled to be played at United from the 10th to the 13th of November with Tony O'Donnell as the Manager. Due to a lack of entries in the Doubles and the Grades competitions these were cancelled. Perhaps the proximity of the two Croquet NZ tournaments at United in mid October and mid November cannibalised the entries as they aimed at the same players.

With the withdrawal of the fifth entrant to the CCA Open Singles the remaining 4 competitors were given the option of playing five rounds over the scheduled weekend. This would have involved the Manager also playing but the players' preferred option was to play a round robin event with three games on the Saturday. Games went according to seeding so in the final round Peter Parkinson played and beat Ian Campbell in the match deciding first and second whilst Maguaritte Rogers beat Owen Evans for third. In both the final matches the higher handicapped player had a good chance of winning when playing their last turn before making an error enabling their opponent to peg out.

CNZ 0-3 & 4+
