Car passes

The public car park next to Hagley Tennis has a three-hour time limit on weekdays.

The council provides a limited number of passes that allow members to park longer then the three hours. Unfortunately there are not sufficient for all our members with cars. These have been allocated to those who have been members longest. Some members who no longer need their pass have returned them so other members may get one.

Car passes have the car registration number on them and so are not transferrable. We do not have any temporary passes that can be given to visitors.

If you are playing in an interclub or a tournament during the week, please consider parking in the public park so visitors can park at the club.

If you have a need for one, see the secretary.

AC Interclub

The AC interclub was played before Christmas. The Tuesday United team won their block. The final against St James Park was rained out and was played Monday 13 February.

It was a close match at three games each, but St James Park won by two hoops.

Maud Trainor

The Maud Trainor is a Golf Croquet handicap singles event played at United on a Wednesday morning. The Swiss draw ensures players, as the competition advances, play against those having similar success.

The two dozen entrants play two games with morning tea in between making it a as much a social event as a competition. This gives eight games over the four mornings and at least six games must be played to be eligible for winning. Currently our Galina Worley and St James's Kay Blackburn lead having won five of their six games.

What does it take to run a croquet club?

There has been comment on where the money we get is used and the use of volunteers.

We have increased club reserves substantially over the past decade whilst improving our stock of top quality balls and hoops. We now have hot water in the kitchen, a new kitchen with new dishwasher (\$xx), a new BBQ and a new fence (\$19,900). We have enough mallets to cope with large numbers of visitors and a variety for new members to borrow and try before buying their own.

Our income from subscriptions is (very approximately \$8k p.a.).

The cost of maintaining our lawns if we needed to use entirely outside labour is approximately \$25,000 pa but is about \$8000 using a lot of volunteer labour.

The cost of a new lawn mower would be over \$40k if we could buy new, or about \$15k second hand.

Many members have given, and continue to give, huge amounts of their time to the club to ensure its long term survival. The form of this help comes in many areas, one of which is corporate events. Suggestions that the club does not need substantial reserves are completely false because we are so reliant upon volunteer labour to be able to function at all.

Before the start of this season setting out the lawns took 20–30 hours of volunteer effort.

The income generated from Corporate events is critical to the long term survival of the club. They also serve as a method of bringing players new to croquet into the sport. They may not join United, but several have joined their local Canterbury club.

The cost to equip one trolley is \$2,500 (hoops at \$1000, two set of ball at \$700 each and peg, clips, flags at \$100)

Learning the rules

Starting with this newsletter I will be including an item explaining some aspect of the rules of croquet. To use the correct terminology that should be AC Laws and GC Rules, but I will use rules here to keep it simple. The Laws and Rules are in the yearbook which also has the tournament regulations, handicapping regulations details of all croquet associations and clubs in New Zealand, a list of all affiliated players and a calendar of tournament throughout NZ. The Laws and Rules are also published separately. I strongly recommend that you have ready access to the rules. You can buy a copy or use the club's copy.

This month's rule comes from observing that many people put the corner flags in the wrong position.

The boundary of the lawn is the edge of the painted line nearest the lawn and can also be a string. The corner flag should be placed so it just touches the two boundaries that meet at the corner as shown in the diagram.

AC and GC have different rules as to when a ball is out. In GC the ball is out if over half of the ball is over the lawn boundary. The ball is placed so that its centre is over the lawn boundary.


In AC a ball is out if any part of the ball is touching or over the lawn boundary. If it is not clear if the ball is out, there are prescribed methods to test. Ask someone if you want to learn how to do this test.

Lawns

The top-dressing with soil has finally been completed after further weather delays and mechanical problems.

All lawns have been marked out and are available to use. However, please use lawns 1 and 2 first and use the other lawns when these are already in use. Also, please check the lawn status board that is visible through the equipment shed window for any changes.

The lawns are still very soft after all the wet weather that we have had. Merely dropping your mallet, especially on its corner, can create an indentation. If this happens unintentionally, please use a key or something to lift the indentation and restore the turf.


