Club AGM and lunch



Hoops

When putting in hoops they don't have to be hammered in until the tops of the carrots are flush with the ground. They should be pushed in only until they are firm. As they are used, and the hole is worn, they will need to be pushed in further. By starting with then proud, they will last longer before they need to be moved.

The rules allow for at least a half-inch (13mm) tolerance and they won't interfere with the ball.



If you must use a mallet to put in hoops, use only a rubber mallet and hit them only over the wire.





The top crown on one set of hoops has a slight bow which means that the vertical wires are no longer vertical. Careful use will ensure that they last longer.

Leaves

Orders for the separate GC Rules booklet must be with the secretary by Monday 20 August. It will be a pocket-sized format (10.5 x 14.8 cm) and will cost \$7.50. They should be delivered in September. A copy can be downloaded from the Croquet NZ website croquet.org.nz. Click About Us on the menu, then Yearbook. Alternatively, you can download it

from the latest blog on the club website or under *News* in the right-hand column.

Handicap changes for Association Croquet

The handicap system for AC has been changed and most players will have had their AC handicap changed for this season. If yours has not been changed see our club handicapper, Mary Morrison, before you play any AC games in a competition.

This change aligns New Zealand handicaps with those in Australia and the UK. That means, if you are playing someone from those countries, you can use your AHS card as you normally do.

You can still use your existing card to record games, but all the tables have changed. A copy of the new tables is on the notice board.

You can download the new AHS card under the members' information on our website (see below). A stock of new AC AHS cards is also available.

Handicap change for Golf Croquet

There has been a small change to the handicapping system for GC. It affects only the index point changes for level doubles games.

This means that the small table on the GC AHS cards is out of date. The new table is in the new GC Rules and stickers are available to update the table. As CNZ still has a large stock of the old cards this will apply if you start a new card.

Alternatively, you can just update the left-hand column in the table.

Changes to the GC Rules

You have been told about the fifth edition of the GC Rules that now apply in New Zealand. This edition introduces a number of significant changes.

If you ordered a copy of the new rules and have not received it, please see John. If you did not order a copy, the club has several spare copies that can be purchased for \$7.50.

If you wish to order a shirt, see Mary. Cost is \$35.




Promoting croquet

Control of weeds

The short working bee on Saturday 15 September removed three large buckets of weeds from our lawns. The weather was great, and everyone enjoyed the pizza afterwards.

Jenny and others have been picking over weeds that weren't removed at the working bee.

The area between lawns 1 and 2 still have a very large number of starweed. This is particularly difficult to remove. Few herbicides are effective, and the roots are almost impossible to remove cleanly. Each plant has dozens of very fine roots and the smallest piece left will regrow.

Chris has arranged to do a trial on starweed control. You will notice that the area between lawns 1 and 2 has been marked into strips. A different treatment will be applied to each strip, including Banvine, Grazon and others.

Please leave this area alone so the trial can proceed undisturbed.
